

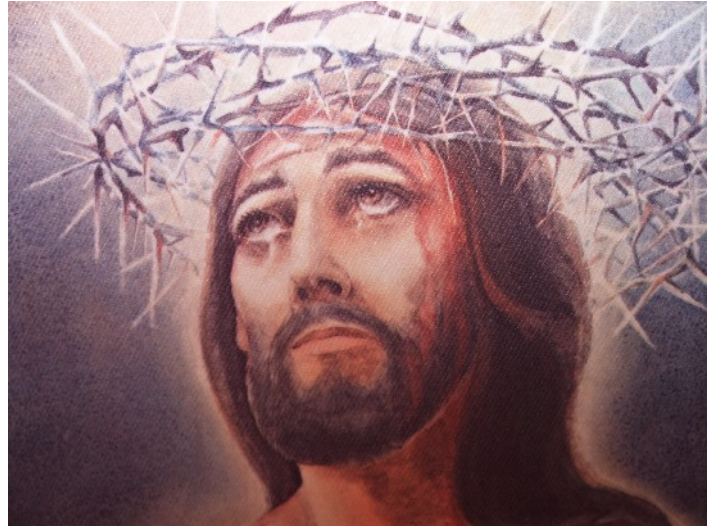

world without end. Amen.**
